Altogether, we got five or six huge bags of trash, several small bags, five anchors, a tire, and the remains of a lawn chair. We had the divers in teams and each was briefed by Chris Hellyer and Terry, our Instructor and Divemaster for the day. We followed the rules for safety and fun. The divers only went 30' deep to find all this trash; we were barricaded in by the Coast Guard Auxiliary and three other boats belonging to members, and friends Frank Mayo and Janet McCully stayed on the boats to maintain our protection. The Coast Guard also had a man on a PWC going out to meet boats that were coming too close to our area. We had diver-down flags and signs (explaining what that means) on two of the boats to try and educate the masses.

A picnic for the clean up participants went off very well, thanks to our grillmaster Wes Gonzales, and we had enough food to feed a few dozen hungry Girl Scouts that were cleaning the shore near our dive site. (Man, those girls can eat, they put some of our men to shame!)
