**Sailfish were using live baits (goggle-eye jacks, threadfin herring and pinfishes). "Most of the salts were in 180 to 200 feet of water off Jupiter Inlet," he said. To prove that it was no accident, he went out on the following day and caught seven sailfish, a total of 20 in two days. "You need to fish far enough offshore to get away from the banks, otherwise you will waste your bait and feeding banter."**

#### Port Canaveral reef gets addition today

Eighty-eight concrete structures that look like large white balls are scheduled to be sunk at an existing artificial reef site today 16 miles off Port Canaveral, Fla. The structures (one two to six feet across and weigh from 375 to 6,000 pounds each).

The three-square-mile area already has 70 "reef balls" that were deployed last May. The artificial reef is expected to become a habitat for marine life and provide a boon for recreational divers and anglers.
