



Reefs are re-created

This is no giant Cheddar cheese but an ingenious way of creating artificial reef structures. The American-made Reef Ball mimics natural coral heads and, during a 5-month trial in Florida, test samples quickly attracted coral populations, fish and invertebrates. Even divers liked them.

Even divers used them.
Using a fibreglass mould, the Reef Bull is formed in concrete, textured carefully to encourage coral settlement and growth. During manufacture, an internal bladder is fitted so that the device can be sunk in a controlled fashion by divers and placed exactly where it is wanted. The bladder is removed to leave an ecologically sound reef replica.

Reef Balls can be deployed singly or joined together with a specifically designed linkage to form larger structures. Those interested in the product write to: Reef Ball Development
