Experimental concrete fish at tractors will be sunk on a Sout Carolina reef as part of a national program to evaluate the effective ness of the units.

Reef Ball Development Group of Doraville, Ga., recently launched program called Reef Balls Aroun the Nation to place 100 or more "reef balls" in every reef-buildin program in the nation.

Reef balls are hollow concret structures three to six feet in diameter that are molded around a reusable, inflated bladder. About 12 reef balls of three different size will be sunk on the Kiawah Ree (4KI) southeast of Charleston.

South Carolina is the second state to participate in the program More than 300 reef balls recently were added to artificial reefs of the Florida coast.
